### Introduction

#### Domestic violence is a serious problem...

- In Northern Ireland domestic violence accounts for approximately one-fifth of all recorded violent crime.
- On average there are five domestic violence deaths in Northern Ireland every year.
- Last year 1138 women and 1090 children stayed in Women's Aid refuges throughout Northern Ireland.
- No single agency can address the complexities of domestic violence alone. Many organisations have a role to play in the prevention of domestic violence, the protection of victims and holding perpetrators to account, and the provision of support to victims and their families.

Tackling Violence at Home, the government's strategy for addressing domestic violence and abuse in Northern Ireland, recognises the need for a co-ordinated approach by all the relevant government departments, statutory and voluntary agencies to the prevention of domestic violence and an effective response where it occurs.

Women's Aid believes that agencies' interventions and responses to victims of domestic violence can be improved and made more effective through awareness raising and training on domestic violence. The need for staff in all relevant agencies to access such training is acknowledged in Tackling Violence at Home.

Introduce facilitators (who have accessed our training programme impact of domestic violence on children and young people and Protective Behaviours) to strategies which deal with the prevention of abuse of children and young people

By the end of this programme you will be able to:

Understand the content of the *Helping Hands* activity pack The pack increases and explores children's understanding of feeling safe as well as the promotion of behaviours which will contribute to a safe environment.

Understand the content of *Heading for Healthy Relationships* (formerly *No Fear*) activity pack. The pack increases and explores young people's understanding of the difference between healthy and unhealthy relationships.
